## Celebrating Togetherness:

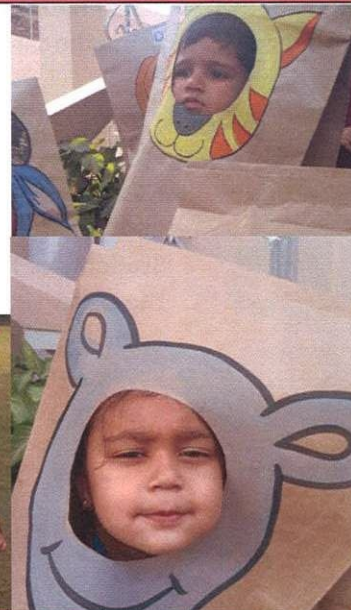
