As the situation with COVID-19 continues to evolve, people are naturally anxious to learn more about BLPS's ongoing response to the situation. I therefore want to share some additional information about the remote learning protocols.

Faculty in each of our four divisions (KG, Primary, Middle & Sr. Secondary) reviewed and practiced our remote learning protocols. While each division has its own age-appropriate practices, there are commonalities that inform this work at every grade level. These include:

- A Commitment to Continuity of Learning: We are fully committed to ensuring that your child's learning experience remains rich and rewarding. Though there may be some "growing pains" if we were to institute remote learning, our teachers are ready and eager to help your child succeed.
- Faculty will be available: Our faculty has been asked to be accessible to your child and you via email. Teachers will respond to all communication as soon as possible and within 24 hours.
- Academic Coordinators shall share more information: Academic Coordinators will send additional information that is needed to institute remote learning. Just know that we have careful plans in place and are ready to implement them if necessary.
- Continue to Report Absences: Even in times of remote learning, it is helpful for us to know if your child is ill and unable to participate in classes. Please continue send leave application to school to report absences.

In the event that we do institute remote learning, here are ways that you and your child can make the process as smooth as possible:

Students

- Show up for synchronous learning if your teacher requests a Zoom or Jiomeet.
- Complete assignments on time and do your best work.
- Communicate with your teacher if you need help.

Parents/Guardians

- Establish a daily routine for engaging in learning activities.
- Monitor Whats app / email for communication from the school.
- Continue to report absences.
- Engage your child in dialogue about learning.
- Notify your child's teacher if they need to turn in an assignment late or miss a virtual class.
- Establish times for your student to turn off screens.
- Encourage physical activity.

We have no idea whether we will need to initiate remote learning during the months ahead. But if we do, we are prepared to make it a dynamic and successful experience for everyone.

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
