FOCUS ON THE PROCESS TO GET RESULTS

Students have once again achieved strong results in the CBSE Board Examinations Term-1 2021/22. BLPS's average score is higher than the CBSE's global average, widening the gap between ourselves and other CBSE schools around the world (100% of our students have passed without dropping even a single subject). We commend our teachers for another outstanding year. Their commitment to the students and school is what drives these exceptional academic results. On behalf of the parents and school, we applaud them for always challenging the students to achieve more than what they could have 90% and above, 41 students scored in the range of 80% - 90%, 8 students secured 70% - 80%, whereas one student bagged
