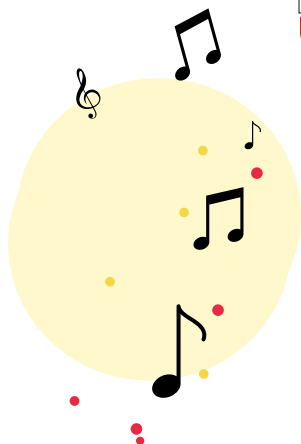
TINY TINKERERS: TOOL TIME FOR TOTS!
