We are excited to announce a flexibility to the Adventure Journey requirements:

-Bronze Level: The Practice
Adventure Journey can be
waived if the NAO considers
that adequate preliminary
training is done, and the
requirements of the
Adventurous Journey. This

adjustment is aimed at making the Award Programme more accessible and encouraging wider participation at the introductory level.

-Silver & Gold Levels: The Practice Adventure Journey remains a mandatory component. Participants at these levels are required to complete The Preliminary Training, the Practice Journey and the Qualifying Journeys to meet the programme's standards.


