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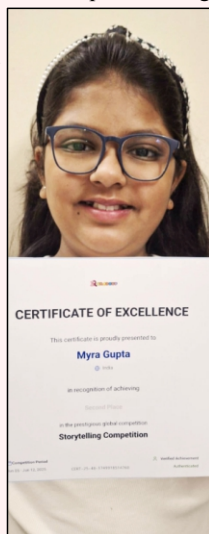
DIALOGUE, DIPLOMACY & DISTINCTION!

INTERNATIONAL ART ACCOLADES: SKETCHING SUCCESS!



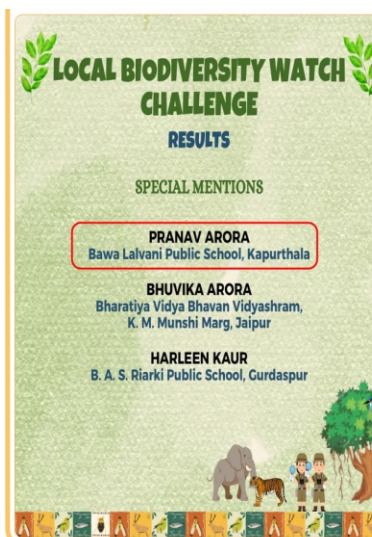

BHARATIYA BHASHA UTSAV: ECHOES OF BENGAL!

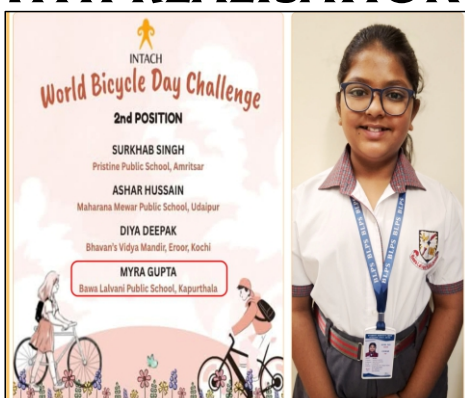

RIMS REVOLVING WITH REALISATION! VERDANT VIBES: NURTURING SOULS NATURALLY!

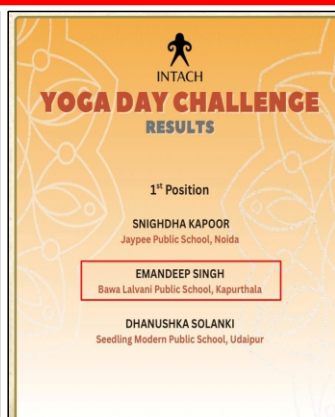
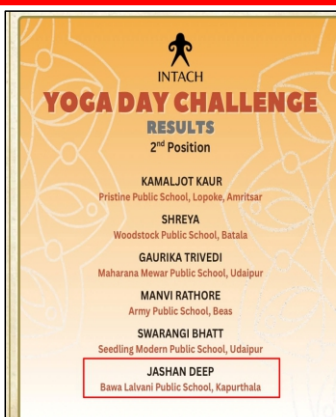
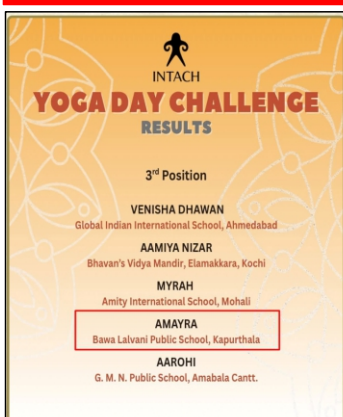
